



I FOUND A BABY SQUIRREL

Is the squirrel visibly injured?

Does the baby have obvious broken bones, bleeding, have fly eggs, or fleas? Is the baby cold and/or wet? Did the squirrel run to you? If so, please keep the baby warm and **contact a wildlife rehabilitator**.

Is the squirrel a juvenile?

These little ones have bodies about 6 inches long, bushy tails, and are fully furred. If the squirrel is not in immediate danger or hurt can be left alone. If the squirrel is injured, coming to you, or in danger, please **contact a wildlife rehabilitator**.

Is the baby very young?

Hairless, or little hair, eyes closed, thin tail. These little ones have their best chance with mom. Put the baby in a box and place it at the base of a tree. Play the YouTube video and **see if Mom comes back**. If not, contact a wildlife rehabilitator.

While waiting for help please....

Keep the baby in a safe place, like a cardboard box or kennel, in a warm, dark area. Please **do not try to feed or give water**, as this could be detrimental to the squirrel's survival. The most important thing right now is **safe and warm**.
